Why study Politics?

More than ever politics is everywhere:

- from global issues such as the environment, super power relations
- To matters of fierce national controversy such as the ongoing Covid crisis, Brexit negotiations and the future of the United Kingdom.
- To matters of individual politics such as the role of political parties in government and the impact that political ideologies have on our own personal views.
- The qualification will help students to fully grasp the concepts behind these issues by studying their roots while understanding the effect they have on our lives right now.

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WHAT WILL I STUDY?

- ➤ The course covers three broad areas;
- The government and politics of the UK: students will focus on key concepts of the British political system (33%)
- The government and politics of the USA: its impact on key issues such as Civil Rights, with a comparison between the UK and US political systems focusing on key areas (33%)
- Political ideas: covering a range of ideologies from feminism to ecologism and exploring key debates surrounding each ideology (33%)


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CAREER OPPORTUNITIES
