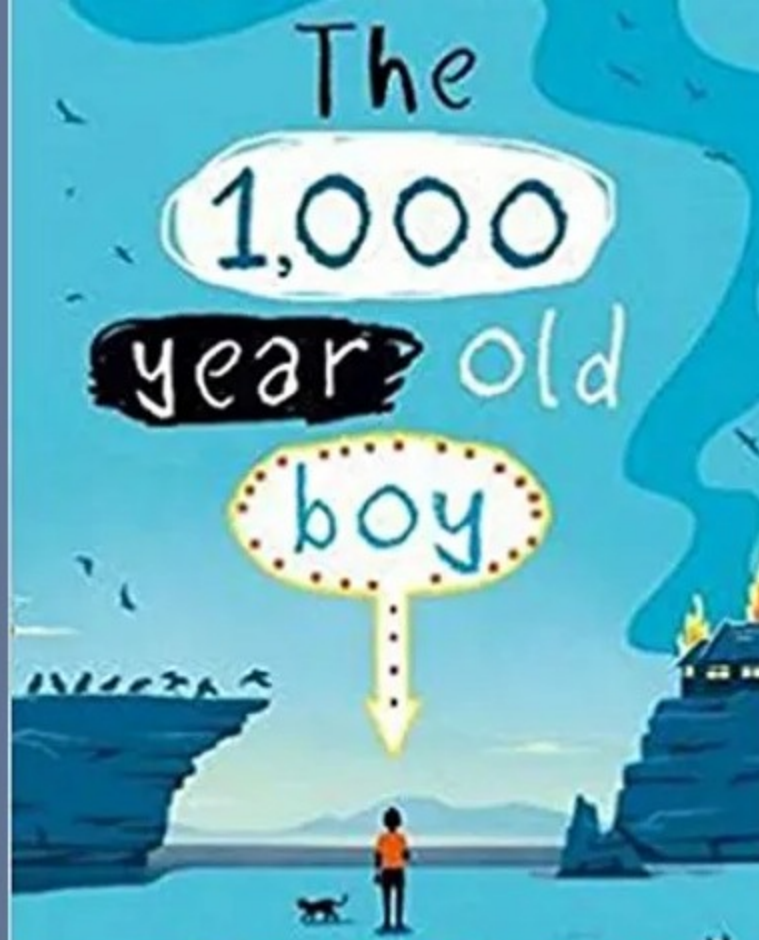


The 1000 Year Old Boy - Ross Welford

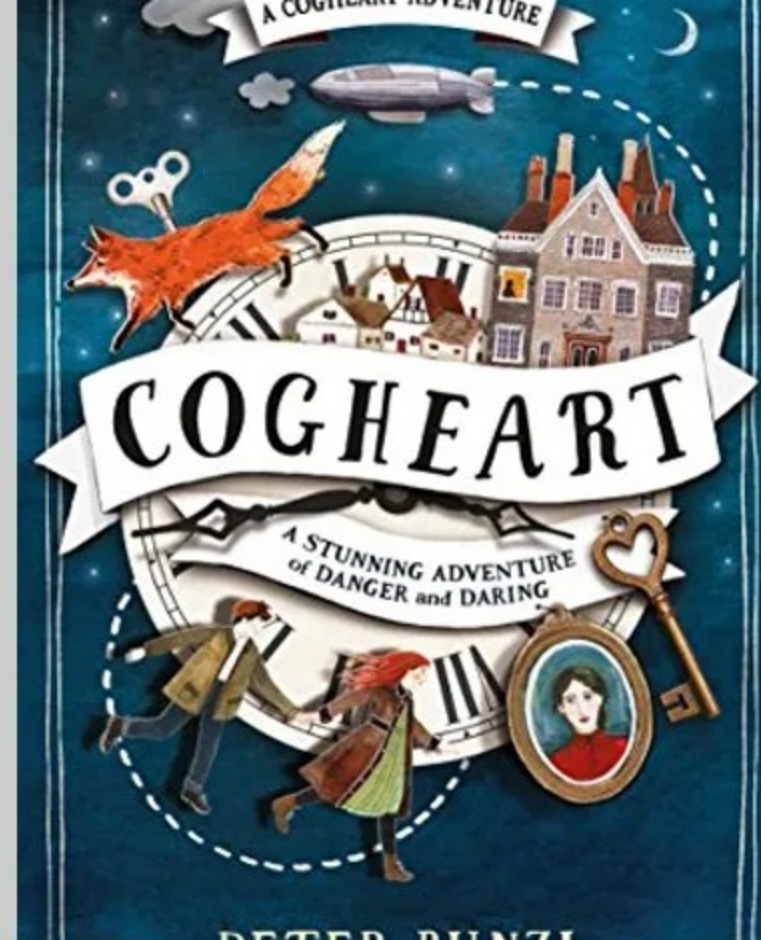


Cogheart - Peter Bunzl

Lily's life is in mortal peril. Her father is missing and now silver-eyed men stalk her through the shadows. What could they want from her?

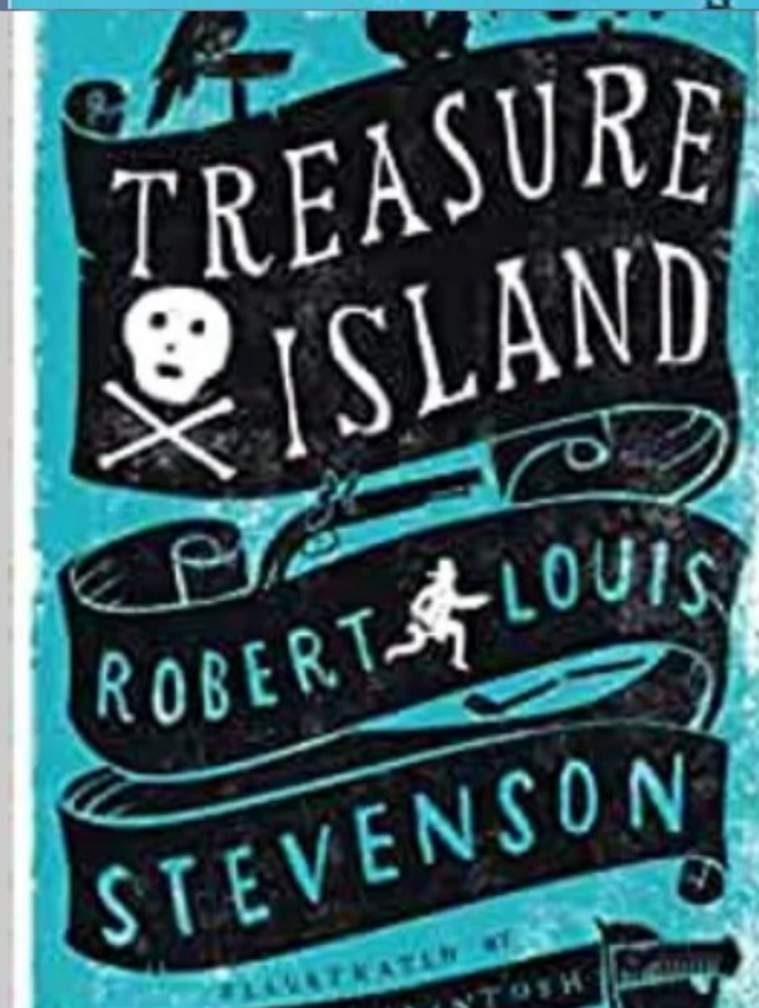

Treasure Island - Robert Louis Stevenson

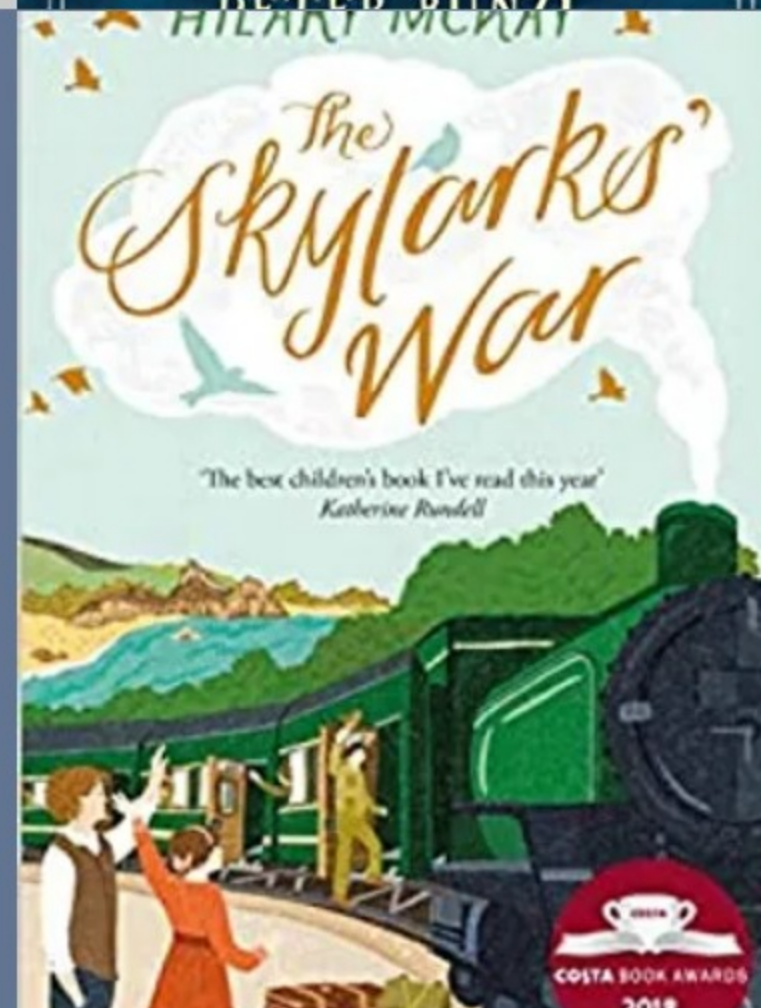

The Skylarks' War is a beautiful story following the loves and losses of a family growing up against the harsh backdrop of World War One, from the award-winning Hilary McKay.

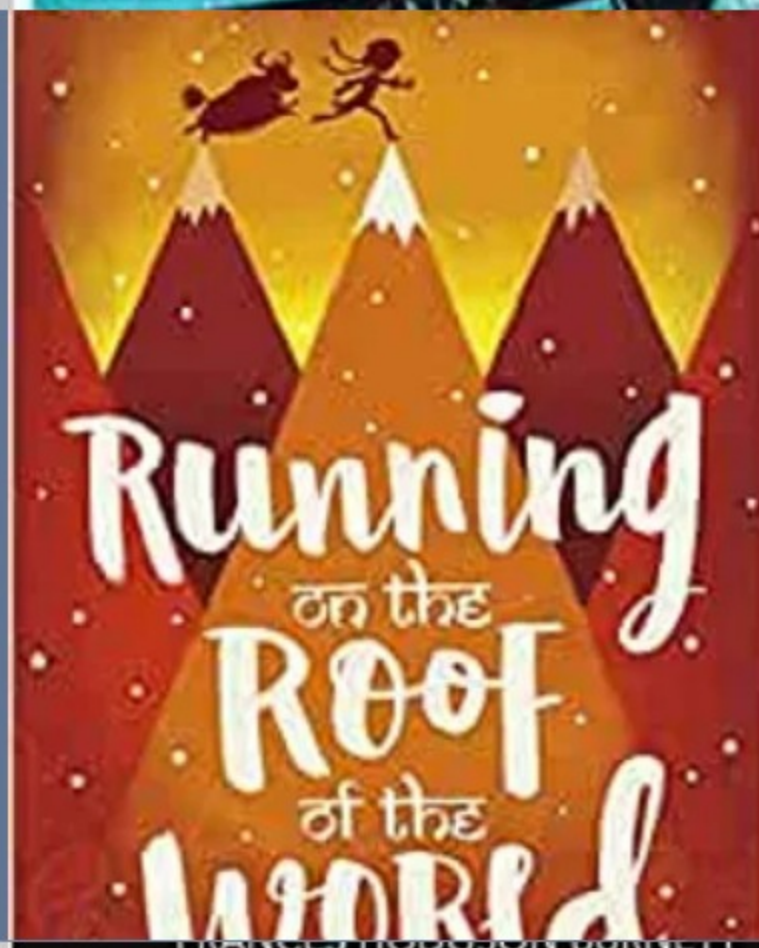

Running on the Roof of the World - Jess Butterworth

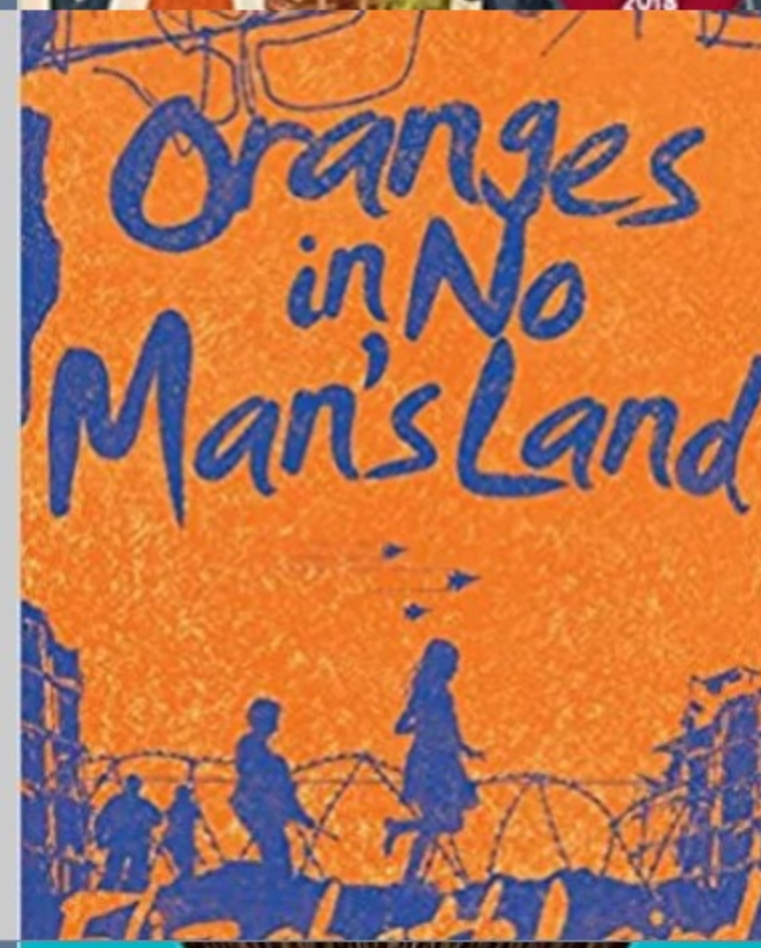

And so, with a backpack of Tash's father's mysterious papers and two trusty yaks by their side, their extraordinary journey across the mountains begins.



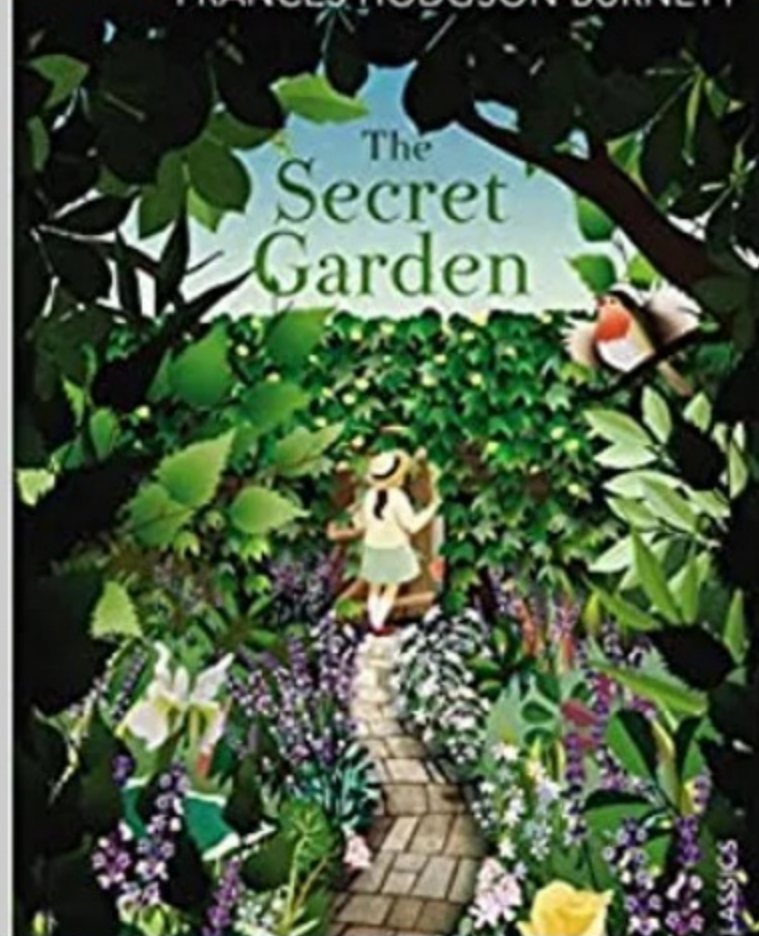
Oranges in No Man's Land - Elizabeth Laird

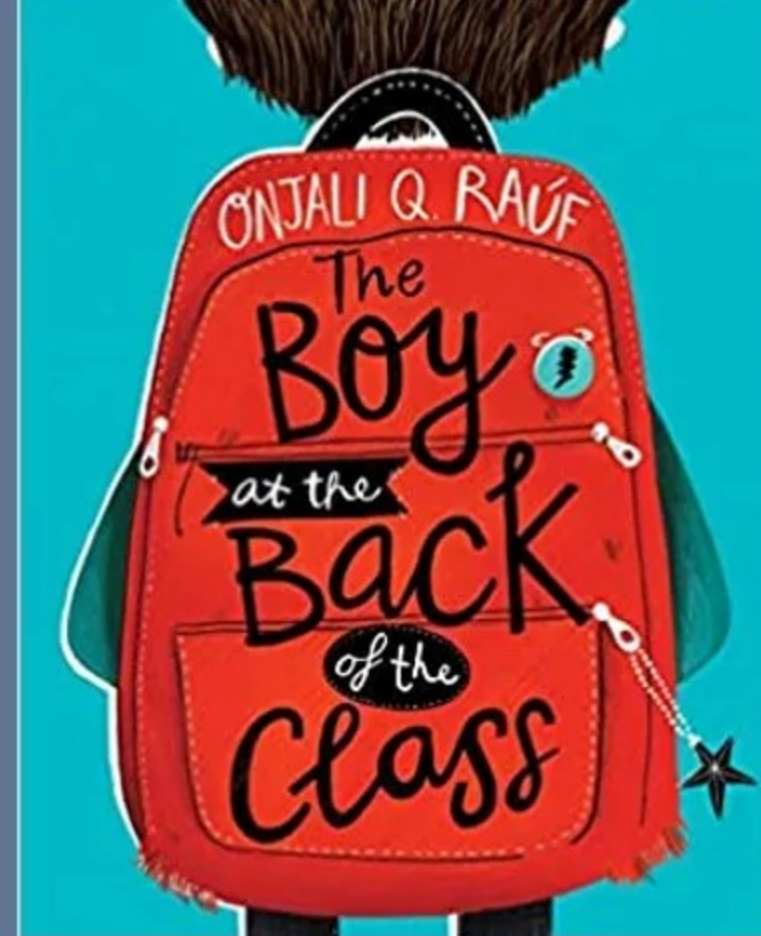
The Secret Garden - Frances Hodgson Burnett

The Boy at the Back of the Class - Onjali Rauf

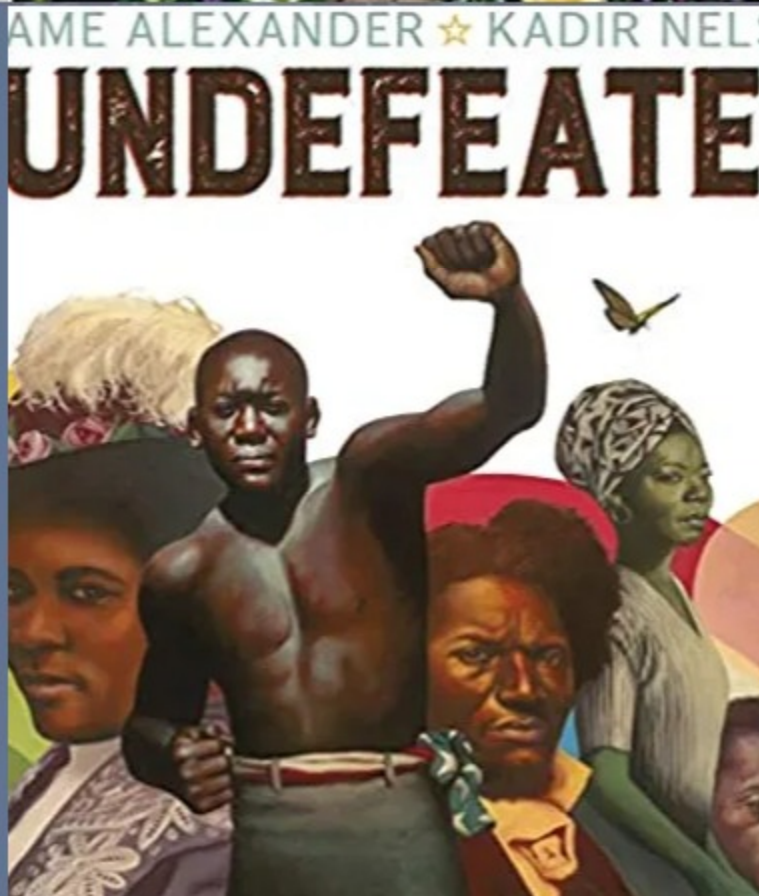

The Undefeated - Kwame Alexander

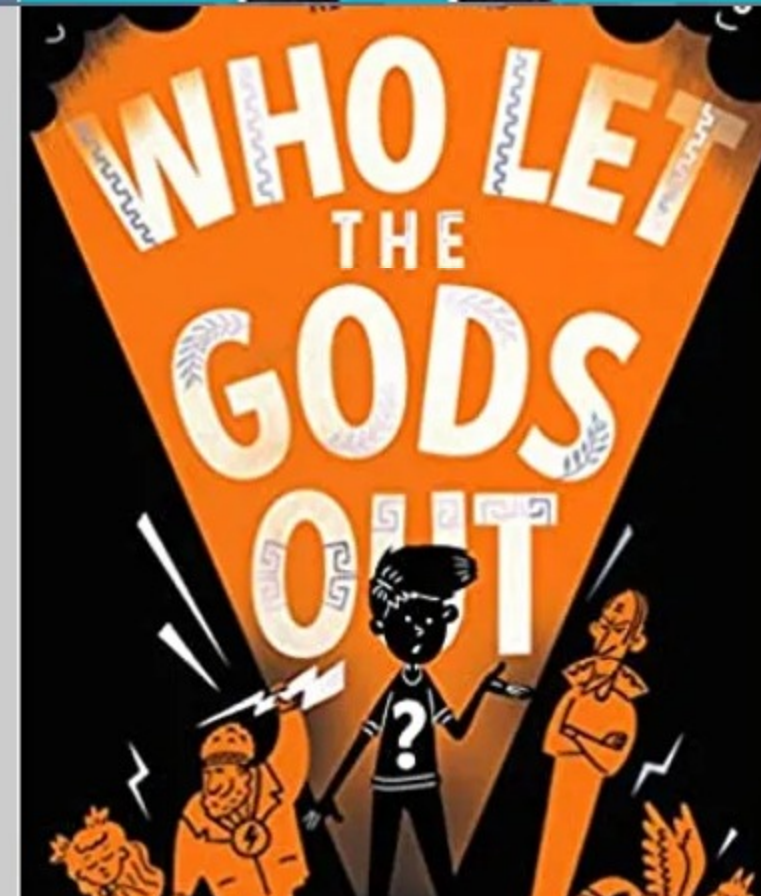
